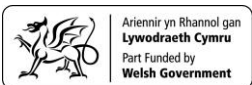




PROSIECT MAELGI: CYMRU

FISHERS BECOME ANGELSHARK STEWARDS



- 7 fishers met to talk about the project and provide leaflets.
- 2 fishers completed timeline analysis and participatory mapping exercises.
- 3 fishers trained and received genetic packs.

STATUS AND ECOLOGY OF ANGELSHARKS UNDERSTOOD



- 6 new records collected from fisher engagement, dating back to the 1970s.
- 2 books and 7 photos with a reference to Angelsharks collected, dating back to 1930s.
- 10 citizen science volunteers trained in archival research.
- Initial analysis of data collected completed.
- Angel Shark Project: Wales team undertook the first Angelshark night snorkel survey.



SHARING INFORMATION ACROSS THE GENERATIONS

- Web and social media reached 55,984 people
- Team attended 5 events across Wales.
